Arjan de Haan is Social Development and Policy Adviser at the UK Department for International Development (DFID), Beijing Office, where he manages rural development and knowledge programs, contributed to the DFID response to the Wenchuan earthquake, and leads on developing support to South-South learning. He has been with DFID since 1998, and worked on social science research, Poverty Reduction Strategy Papers, social protection, budget support, and work on inequality and social exclusion.
