



Escaping Poverty Traps

Mike Lurie is the Senior Policy Advisor in the Trade Policy and Programs deputation of the Economic, Energy and Business Affairs Bureau of the U.S. Department of State. Mr. Lurie has served in this position since December 2007. He principally focuses on international food security and Africa and Latin America economic issues. Mr. Lurie joined the U.S. Department of State in 2005, having previously worked in the private sector, with the U.S. Campaign for Burma and as a Social Justice Fellow in Israel working on human rights issues. Mr. Lurie spearheaded the State Department's campaign to strengthen bilateral trade in sub-Saharan Africa, including by launching new Trade and Investment Framework Agreements (TIFAs) with Angola, Mauritius, Liberia, Rwanda, and the East African Community. Mr. Lurie also led efforts to develop the U.S.-Brazil Economic Partnership Dialogue (EPD), which was launched in December 2007 and the Pathways to Prosperity in the Americas Initiative, which was launched in September 2008. Mr. Lurie was part of a small team that developed and secured Congressional support in May 2008 for food aid and other measures to address the rise in global food prices. He is a member of G8 Food and Agriculture Experts Group.
